On January 10, 2019, Japan notified the World Trade Organization (WTO) of proposed revoking the designation of Tylosin Phosphate as a feed additive via G/SPS/N/JPN/610. In the notification, the Ministry of Agriculture, Forestry and Fisheries (MAFF) explains that it will revoke the designation of tylosin phosphate as feed additives since tylosin phosphate is no longer used, produced, imported or expected to be used in the future in/into Japan.
